

## A FREE pattern from

Hello! Thanks for choosing a Vintage Fabric Studio tutorial to make a 12.5" Ohio Star quilt block. In this tutorial I will show you how to make flying geese \& how to put together a simple 3 unit quilt block.

Materials Required:
3 fat quarters of vintage sheet fabric; shown in orange floral/pink floral/low volume stripe
Sewing machine
Coordinating Thread
Rotary cutter, 12" or larger grid ruler, self-healing cutting mat
Scissors
Pins
Iron/Ironing board
OPTIONAL: Spray Starch

NOTE: All seam allowances are 1/4" -- Block is 12.5" unfinished

Ohio Star:

| Cutting | $1-43 / 4 "$ |
| :--- | :--- |
| Diagram | square |

 cut into 8 triangles
$1-7 / 1 / 4$ "square cut into 4 triangles

2-4" squares cut into 4 triangles

## Vintage Fabric Studio

## Cutting Chart:

1-43/4" square (pink floral)
4-4" squares cut into 8 triangles (pink floral)
$2-4$ " squares cut into 4 triangles (LV stripe)
1-71/4"square cut into 4 triangles (orange print)
4-31/2" squares


2. Sew the 2 remaining triangles to the $43 / 4$ " block in the same way and press to the side.

1. Line up low volume stripe triangles in the middle of the $43 / 4$ " pink floral square and sew, press to the darker side.

> Next sew the 2 triangles onto square and press


4. Sew individual parts of the block together into 3 units as shown.

Press seams of middle unit out toward the flying geese. Press seams of the two end units in towards the flying geese. This will allow a really nice nesting of seams when the block is sewn together on the next step.

5. Sew the units together pinning in place as seams are matched up and nested together. Sew and press seams open. Trim block to 12.5". Hooray! making an Ohio Star block. Share on
